

#### Abbey Pumping Station Museum Transport Shed Tours

Corporation Road, Leicester LE4 5PX

Delve into Abbey Pumping Station's Transport Shed to discover an array of fascinating vehicles. Abbey Pumping Station is Leicester's Museum of Science and Technology, displaying Leicester's industrial, technological and scientific heritage. Situated adjacent to the National Space Centre, the two attractions tell the story of over 200 years of science and technology from the early days of steam and industry, to the space exploration of today. Join a tour of the transport shed, home to several historic vehicles including fire engines, buses and steam powered vehicles.

#### All Saints' Church: War Memorials Project

Highcross Street, Leicester LE1 4PH

Thursday 6 September 2pm - 5pm Friday 7 September 3pm - 6pm Saturday 8 September 10am - 6pm Sunday 9 September 2.30pm - 5pm

All Saints' Church is one of only five churches to survive from medieval Leicester. The chancel of the church now provides a safe home for many different types of war memorials, disguarded from buildings that have closed or changed their use. Over 40 war memorials of various types have been taken into care preventing them from being permanently lost, including some recently acquired spectacular memorials such as a 10 feet 8 inches tall stained glass World War II window.

This is a unique opportunity to see the memorials and the story boards and view the light boxes of the three stained glass World War I memorial windows from the now closed St Saviour's Church.

There is limited disabled parking. There is a gentle, anti-slip ramp into the Chancel. Families are welcome but there are no specific features for children.

## Bishop St Methodist Church

10A Bishop Street, LE1 6AF

Saturday 8 September 10am - 4pm

A Georgian Grade II listed historic Methodist Chapel with an impressive interior including a beautifully carved Father Smith organ case. Other interior highlights include the horseshoe gallery and the Italianate wrought ironwork on the pulpit. Guided tours of the chapel and heritage room will be available, and also the opportunity for family historians to consult the historic registers and additional heritage displays. There will be a special display on Leicester's 19th century pioneering women preachers.



#### **Belgrave Cemetery**

The Victorian Belgrave
Cemetery contains a large
number of graves and
memorials to those killed in
both World Wars resting in
an arboretum of 100 year old
trees. The Friends of Belgrave
Cemetery will be on hand to
highlight the interesting
stories behind some of those
laid to rest there and there is
an opportunity to join a
guided walk.

Sensible footwear must be worn. No specific disabled parking but plenty of parking spaces available. Pushchair/pram access on footpaths only. Cemetery information for visitors trying to find a particular grave will also be available. All children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult.

#### Belgrave Hall and Gardens Heritage Tours

An 18th century period house surrounded by historic walled gardens, Belgrave Hall provides an oasis of tranquillity in a busy city. Located in the Belgrave Conservation Area, the Hall is surrounded by fascinating historic buildings including the National School, Cross Corners. St Peter's Church and Belgrave House. Join a tour to learn more about its history and the families who once lived there or simply drop in to enjoy the Hall and gardens.

The church houses the William Carey Museum which celebrates the life of the famous missionary who left Leicester to translate the bible into five Indian languages and the New Testament into twenty more.

City Hall, Leicester City Council's headquarters underwent major refurbishment to create office accommodation and meeting rooms. See the dressing rooms used by the stars and even step out onto the stage.

Drop in to De Montfort University and join tours of three of the university's historic sites, exploring the rich heritage of the university. The centrepiece of the University Heritage Centre is the remains of the Church of the Annunciation. Visit Trinity Chapel, a stone chapel founded in 1330 served Trinity Hospital and view Leicester Castle Great Hall. The hall, a timberframed building with 12th century origins has hosted many illustrious visitors including King Richard III.

There will also be an opportunity to join a handling session featuring materials from the university's archive and arts collections.

Leicester's parks have been a place of recreation for generations. In 1882 Leicester welcomed royal visitors when Abbey Park was officially opened by the Prince and Princess of Wales. Originally smaller, it was later extended to include the site of the 12th century Leicester Abbey, the location of the death of Cardinal Wolsey in 1530. Join a guided tour of sites of historical interest including Abbot Penny's Wall and Cavendish House alongside the modern recreational facilities which make a popular mix of old and new in the park's 135 year history.






