



Higher and Degree Apprenticeships Integrated or Non-Integrated Assessments


How are apprenticeships completed?

Once an apprentice has completed their learning and finished uploading their E-portfolio, they are ready to take the End Point Assessment (EPA).


Who provides a Non-Integrated Assessment?

Employers search for a suitable independent assessor organisation on the Register of End Point Assessor Organisations (RoEPAO) to provide the EPA. Some apprenticeship standards have specific Providers that can be used. The employer then informs De Montfort University (DMU) who will draw down the funding to pay for this. This is called a **Non-Integrated model:**

Independent EPA takes place when the employer is satisfied that the apprentice has developed all the knowledge, skills and behaviours defined in the apprenticeship standard



How is an Integrated Assessment different?

Integrated degree apprenticeships are where DMU provides both the scheduled teaching as well as the EPA. No independent assessor organisation is required. The model below is an **integrated model**:
