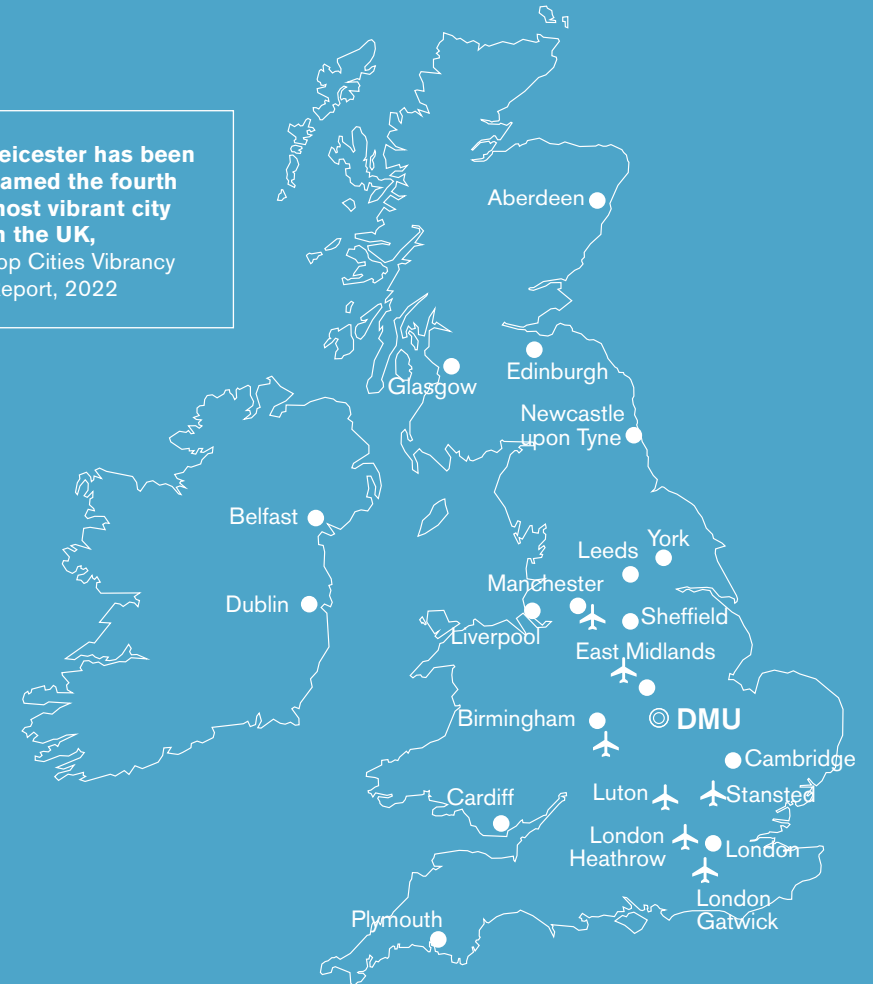

Our campus

We've invested in a stunning campus in the heart of Leicester, where you'll get the best of both worlds – a compact, accessible and safe space to live and study with convenient access to accommodation, shopping, nightlife and all that's on offer in the city centre.

Our campus provides students with a mixture of historic and modern learning environments. We have state-of-the-art facilities such as our Vijay Patel Art and Design Building, which sits alongside sites of historical interest such as the Leicester Castle Business School, which dates back to the 11th Century, making DMU only one of two UK universities with the site of a medieval castle on their campus.

Accommodation

On-campus accommodation is guaranteed for incoming exchange students who apply by the deadline with both semester-long and year-long options being available.

All DMU sourced rooms are modern, self-catered, have internet access and single-sex flat options available, with many featuring en-suite bathrooms, social spaces and on-site gyms. There's also an opportunity to handpick your own room. Bede Hall offers fully adapted rooms for wheelchair users, including kitchens. We understand that safety is key, so all DMU-sourced halls have on-site or on-call security, on-site managers, and CCTV or electronic door entry.





Our City

A big city on your doorstep

We're a campus-based university in the city centre, with the hub of activity in Leicester right on your doorstep – and we're one of the few universities in the UK where you're getting the best of both worlds. Leicester is an affordable place to live, as well as the best city in the East Midlands to live and work (Good Growth for Cities Index, 2022).

Rich in cultural diversity

Famed for its diversity, Leicester is home to one of the biggest celebrations of Diwali outside of India. It's an inclusive city with a long history of welcoming a variety of ethnic communities and religious faiths.

Eating out in Leicester can feel like travelling the globe, offering bars, shops and restaurants influenced by tastes around the world, plus an array of coffee houses and lunch spots, comprising independent local vendors and your favourite restaurant chains.

A city for students

Arts and culture are renowned across our city, home to the biggest comedy festival in the country, live performances at Curve theatre, plus the Phoenix and Showcase cinemas. Leicester's Highcross offers a great shopping experience, and the Lanes complements this with a wealth of independent options.

Home to Leicester City Football Club, Rugby Union's 2021/22 Premiership champions Leicester Tigers, previous British Basketball League champions Leicester Riders and Leicestershire County Cricket Club – sports fans will be spoiled for choice.

A city with links

Leicester's central location means cities such as Birmingham and Nottingham are only a short 30-minute train journey away, there are easy links to many UK airports and the capital city of London is only an hour's train journey.

Furthermore, you can reach the stunning countryside of Leicester in just 20 minutes by bus or bike, giving you the chance to explore the natural beauty of Bradgate Park and Beacon Hill Country Park.

Student life

Our campus culture is friendly and relaxed. We have a range of activities and events on campus, organised by the University and Students' Union, with a range of spaces and catering facilities for you to relax. Join our diverse student community with students from more than 130 countries and feel at home in no time.

Activities

De Montfort's Student Union (DSU)

Whilst on exchange at DMU we encourage you to actively engage with the activities, clubs and societies that belong to DSU. Being part of a society is a great way to integrate into UK student life and meet like-minded individuals.

Sports

We have something for everyone, with more than 30 student-led sports clubs and opportunities to develop your skills on and off the pitch. Our student-led social sport programme offers an extensive range of free sessions from yoga to basketball. In addition, exchange students can take advantage of discounted rates at our QEII Leisure Centre, which boasts a 25-metre swimming pool, climbing wall, sports hall, fitness suite, and dance studio.



Support

We have dedicated staff within the Global Mobility Office (studentexchange@dmu.ac.uk), providing support before, during and after your time at DMU. In cooperation with the International Student Support Team exchange students can benefit from services such as international welcome week, airport pick-ups and a 'buddy' scheme which matches you with a current DMU student to help you settle in.

We also offer orientation and integration events throughout the year including a formal welcome event and a welcome dinner. Through Explore UK, exchange students can also join weekend trips during term-time to a range of towns, cities and cultural attractions throughout the UK.

The university offers a range of support for all of our students:

- **Academic support**
Via our Faculty Student Advice Centres you can get help with printing, IT, equipment rentals and e-learning.
- **Disability and Mental Health support**
Our Disability Advice and Support (DAS) Team offers services tailored to the specific needs of students with physical and sensory disabilities, and medical conditions. The Mental Health Inclusion team also provide support to all students to help to manage and minimise the impact of any mental health difficulties on studies.
- **Religious support**
There is both a Christian prayer room and a Muslim prayer room on campus. Staff are able to offer religious support advice alongside spiritual, pastoral, moral and social care.
- **Centre for English Language Learning**
Free conversational classes and an academic English and study skills course including weekly classes and bookable one-to-one sessions for assignment support are available.

Education 2030

We have developed an innovative and inclusive approach to learning known as Education 2030, which is focused around you and designed to ensure you have the best learning experience possible.

This is DMU's new way of delivering student-centred and future-proofed teaching and learning. It means that the majority of our courses will be delivered to you in a 'block' format, focusing on one subject at a time, with immediate assessment while you are absorbed in the topic.

This new approach is aimed at helping you to benefit from a straightforward timetable that gives you space to absorb and engage with learning materials in depth, faster assessment and feedback, and the opportunity to work closely with your tutors and coursemates so you can get the support you need.

"What we found about working in this block structure is that students have to really commit to it, it's such an intensive process that what evolves from it is a real sense of community. We found this works really well with our students in terms of a clear building of knowledge."
